

OUR PROGRAMS

COMMUNITY PRESCHOOL EDUCATION

An early intervention program for preschool-aged children, with diagnosed developmental delays, disorders and medical diagnoses that impact their ability to successfully participate in their classroom and community settings.

THE APRAXIA PRESCHOOL PROGRAM

Our new preschool program to assist children diagnosed with Childhood Apraxia of Speech. This preschool program is the first of its kind in Alberta and will focus on the unique and specific needs of children with apraxia.

EDMONTON NORTHWEST OUT OF SCHOOL CARE

An Out Of School Care that provides before-school, lunchtime, and after-school care for children aged 5 -12 years old.

EDMONTON NORTHWEST PRESCHOOL

A non-profit preschool located in the Inglewood neighbourhood of Edmonton for children aged 3-5 years old.

WESTMOUNT EARLY LEARNING & CHILD CARE CENTRE

Our newest Community Options Early Learning & Child Care Centre located in the Westmount area for children aged 12 months to 6 years old

EDMONTON NORTHWEST EARLY LEARNING & CHILD CARE CENTRE

Our Centre is located in the heart of the Inglewood community and provides quality care for children aged 12 months to 6 years old.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH & VOLUNTEER ENGAGEMENT

A program dedicated to serving the community, family support services, fundraising, and volunteering.

COMMUNITY PRESCHOOL EDUCATION

The Community Preschool Education team is made up of compassionate and committed staff who are dedicated to supporting children.

Speech Language Pathologists

Speech & Language Pathologists work with children to grow their receptive & expressive language skills.



Occupational Therapists

Occupational Therapists support the child's fine motor development and daily living skills that they require to be successful.

Physical Therapists

Physical Therapists support the child's gross motor development, allowing them to move and play with their peers.

Certified Teachers & Educational Assistants

Certified Teachers & Educational Assistants provide programming that meets the unique needs of each child while ensuring they are valued members of the inclusive classroom.



Community Options is excited to offer a first of its kind, preschool program to assist children diagnosed with Childhood Apraxia of Speech.

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What is Apraxia?

Apraxia or Childhood Apraxia of Speech (CAS) is a motor speech disorder that impacts the ability to speak clearly. In general, these children have a good understanding of what they want to say; however, the brain has difficulty sending the correct signals to the mouth to make the movements necessary for clear speech.

Apraxia - Centered

The Apraxia Preschool Program is a classroom for up to 14 children. Our program uses an intensive therapeutic model as well as other evidence-based best practices and classroom supports. We aim to provide a safe, fun, and supportive environment where children and their families have the opportunity to build the skills they need to be successful in future academic and community environments.

Multidisciplinary Team

The classroom team includes a certified Teacher, a Speech-

Language Pathologist (SLP), and a Speech-Language Pathology Assistant (SLPA). Children are immersed in daily opportunities to practice their individual speech goals, in a supportive and playbased environment. They have access to weekly individual and group therapy sessions with the SLP and SLPA, as well as classroom programming that targets preliteracy and socialemotional skills. Occupational Therapists (OT) and Physical Therapists (PT) provide consultative services for children who need extra support in these areas.

THE APRAXIA PRESCHOOL PROGRAM

EDMONTON NORTHWEST OUT OF SCHOOL CARE



Edmonton Northwest Out Of School Care provides before-school, lunchtime, and after-school care for children who attend Inglewood Elementary School. The Centre is licensed to serve 40 children from 5 to 12 years.

Learning Through Play

Edmonton Northwest OOSC is a recreational program centered around Learning Through Play. Through educational field trips, planned activities, and free play, we give children the chance to learn more about themselves and the world around them. .

Serving more than the Inglewood Community

Edmonton Public School Board has permitted Edmonton Northwest OOSC to have children from outside of Inglewood School. We currently partner with 3 other community schools for after school care.

Our educators support the development of friendships, gaining problem-solving skills, and exploring opportunities for self-awareness and selfexpression. Each child creates a positive sense of self and others.
